

## Clear Space Guideline



## DO:

- Use the bilingual version wherever possible / appropriate
- Print logos with taglines at a minimum size of 1.5" to preserve legibility. If a smaller size is required, use a version without a tagline
- Leave the area equivalent in height (or more) to the Sepsis Canada wordmark clear around the logo for breathing space

## DO NOT:

- Alter the size, relationship or position of the type or maple leaf icon
- Alter the colour of any part of the logo beyond the approved variations
- Overprint type of photos, or place elements over the logo
- Add borders or other graphic elements

## Light.

## Arial

## PowerPoint & MailChimp Typeface

## Regular.

Arial is a widely available PC font that is ideal for use in PowerPoint presentations, e-newsletters and other document types.

### Bold.

Arial has limited options for weights but is available across platforms and operating systems to ensure consistency.

### Italic.

Below is a suggested heirarchy that can be changed as required as long as established sizes are used consistently.



# Typography.

## Color Palette.

## Main Colour System

The primary branding colours of Sepsis Canada are red and grey, representing both the offical colours of Canada (red) and sepsis awareness (red and black).



## **Text Colours**

Black should be used for body text in printed documents, while Dark Grey provides more comfortable reading for digital applications.



## Supporting Palette

Shades of Dark Payne's Grey can be used to create a neutral supporting colour palette as required.
